

If two teams finish with the same record, this is how we figure out who has the higher seed...

1. Head to head matchup.

E.g., If Team A beat Team B twice during the regular season, then Team A would get the higher seed.

2. If they split games, the team that has the highest “margin of victory” gets the higher seed.

- a. E.g., If Team A beat Team B by 14 in the 1st matchup and Team B beat Team A by 10 in the 2nd matchup, then Team A would get the higher seed.

3. If the two teams split games and the “margin of victory” was the same in both games, the team that scored the highest number of points “in their victory” gets the higher seed.

- a. E.g., If Team A beat Team B 100-90 in the 1st matchup and Team B beat Team A 105-95 in the 2nd matchup, then Team B would get the higher seed because they scored 105 points in their victory compared to Team A who scored 100 points in their victory.
